

SCV Mourns Ford Passing

Columbia, TN, 12/30/06—The Sons of Confederate Veterans joins the nation in mourning the passing of President Gerald Ford.

Commander-in-Chief Christopher M. Sullivan, speaking on behalf of more than 32,000 members said, "Our deep condolence goes to the Ford family with sincere respect for the great service rendered throughout President Ford's long, remarkable career."

Commander Sullivan said, "Perhaps our most memorable moment of sincere appreciation for President Ford was when he signed the legislation restoring the citizenship of General Robert E. Lee, long after the general's death."

At that signing, President Ford said, "General Lee's character has been an example to succeeding generations, making the restoration of his citizenship an event in which every American can take pride."

On January 19, 2007, the nation will celebrate the 200th birthday of Robert E. Lee with proclamations and ceremonies scheduled throughout the nation.

"I can only say that I am nothing but a poor sinner, trusting in Christ alone for salvation," said Robert E. Lee

In May 1870, Robert E. Lee, in the presence of a few former Confederate Generals, was asked by Gov. Fletcher Stockdale of Texas, "General, if you would have foreseen the cruel and unjust results of Reconstruction upon the South, would you have surrendered at Appomattox?" Lee rose from his chair and said:

"Governor, if I had foreseen the use those people designed to make of their victory, there would have been no surrender at Appomattox Court house; no sir, not by me. Had I foreseen these results of subjugation, I would have preferred to die at Appomattox with my brave men, my sword in this right hand."

The lives of Generals Lee and Jackson may be summed up by the words of the Apostle Paul when he said, shortly before his death, "For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day; and not to me only, but unto all them also that love His appearing." 2 Timothy 4:6-8

Important Dates in the War of Northern Aggression

Jan. 1, 1863: Confederates under Maj. Gen. John B. Magruder recapture Galveston, Texas, routing three companies of the 42nd Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry.

Jan. 2, 1863: Confederates and Federals battle at Stones River, Tenn., where more than 23,000 soldiers are killed, wounded or captured in three days of fighting.

Jan. 9, 1861: Citadel Cadets turn back The Star of the West, a Union ship loaded with more than 200 Federal troops attempting to reinforce Fort Sumter. This action was the first in the War Between the States.

Jan. 9, 1861: Mississippi secedes from the Union.

Jan. 10, 1861: Florida secedes from the Union.

Jan. 11, 1861: Alabama secedes from the Union.

Jan. 17, 1864: Southern forces under Lt. Gen. James Longstreet rebuff Federals at Dandridge, Tenn., but are unable to pursue fleeing Yankees because of a lack of supplies.

Jan. 19, 1861: Georgia secedes from the Union.

Jan. 26, 1861: Louisiana secedes from the Union.


Jan. 29, 1863: Union troops massacre Shoshoni Indians at Boa Ogoi, Idaho.


